To quote Sherry; "In my life, the people who have this career (Social Work) have helped me most and encouraged me to help myself and make positive changes."

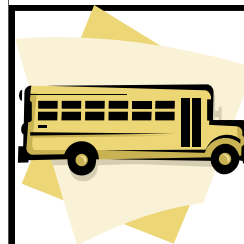


Bryan Wiggle \$250
