very talented individuals will be selling their handmade

artwork, jewelry, furniture, candles, clothing, linens, scrapbooks, painted gourds, soaps, wooden toys, framed pressed flowers, cut metal decor, tole painted items, wooden kitchen and decorator items, etc.

The Agricultural Commodities Store, which will be located in the center of the festival grounds under the big white tent, will offer for purchase fresh local agricultural products such as walnuts, almonds, pecans, pistachios, plums, figs, etc. Sunbursts, seasoned walnuts, and chocolate-dipped prunes will also be available. Free samples of some items will be offered as well.

After you have made your commodities purchase we encourage you to visit the Agricultural Education area where you will be able to learn more about the local crops and our scholarship recipients.

This is an event for all ages. The Diaper Derby will take place at noon in front of the stage. The Lil' Farmer's Corner will have free games and activities for the children. A bounce house will also be available for the kids to jump and play in. Tehama County 4-H clubs will provide a petting zoo and educational displays..

The California Highway Patrol, Tehama County Sheriff's Department and Cal Fire will have informational booths at the Festival. They will be happy to answer any questions that you may have.

A variety of live local entertainment will take place on the stage all day including: The Debadoo Dance Company, The Jonathan Skillman Family Fiddlers, , Loosely Strung (Bluegrass Fiddle), Patti Anglia & Terry Kirby (Easy Coun-

try) and Linda Roland & Friends. Raffle prize winners will be announced from the stage throughout the day as well.

A large display of orchard and farm tractors and equipment will be on display at the front of the school grounds. Antique tractors and engines will also be there. The owners of these pieces of machinery will enjoy showing you how their equipment works and will answer your questions.

Author Alley will, once again, feature several local authors and their publications. All of these authors will have their books available for purchase and signing. Ruth Myhre, from Corning, will be present with her new children's book entitled, Chase-N-Cows. Adam and Celeste Deem, authors as well as illustrator Ryan M. Lamb will be on hand with their book entitled, Saving Li'l Smokey. Glenn Cox, of Los Molinos will be bringing his book, The Way The Game Was Played. Author George Keck of Corning will be there with his book Smarter Than Einstein? Braedon Kuts, author of All In A Night's Dream will also join us with books on hand.

Oh yes, you won't want to miss out on the freshly prepared food! Come hungry and enjoy delicious tri-tip sandwiches, authentic carnitas, Oriental chicken salad, baked potato, and/or a hot dog.
